

# Library, Parks Facing Risky Futures

The Cabell County Library and the Greater Huntington Park and Recreation District are locked in a legal battle with the Cabell County Board of Education over the school board's high-handed and short-sighted action in slashing its funding for the library and the park system. In drawing up its plan for the new excess levy to be submitted to the voters next year, the school board reduced its library funding from about \$1.7 million to less than \$200,000 and eliminated the \$450,000 it currently provides the park system. The school board has said it's been forced to tighten its budget.

Library and park board officials point to long-standing pieces of state legislation that require the school board to help fund the library and park system. The school board has labeled those measures "unconstitutional." The library and park board have sued the school board, seeking that the funds be restored. Cabell Circuit Judge Gregory Howard has ruled in favor of the library and the park system, but the school board have vowed to appeal his ruling to the West Virginia Supreme Court of Appeals. Library Executive Director Breana Bowen is by no means exaggerating when she describes such a massive loss of funding as "catastrophic" for the library, its staff and the library's many users.

It's hard to see how the library could cope with such a sharp loss without drastic cuts in its operations, such as reducing the library's hours of operation, temporary closures of some branch libraries, leaving vacant positions unfilled and possible layoffs off library staffers. Not a pretty picture, is it? The park board sees equally dire consequences if it loses funding from the levy.

Ironically, the library owes its very existence to a letter penned in 1901 by W.H. Coyle, who was then the superintendent of the Huntington Independent School District (the predecessor of today's county-wide school board). Aware that steel tycoon and philanthropist Andrew Carnegie was helping build libraries in many communities, Coyle wrote him, asking if he would consider aiding in the construction of a building to house a fledgling library that had been started by concerned Huntington citizens.

In reply, Carnegie said he would agree to provide \$25,000 for a building if a suitable lot was provided and an annual \$2,500 guaranteed for the library's operation. Huntington City Council immediately bought a downtown lot on the northeast corner of 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 9<sup>th</sup> Street and the school district agreed to provide the \$2,500 needed to operate the library. In 1904, what came to be known as the "Carnegie Library" opened its doors for the first time. For many years, the school district's offices were located on the second floor of the building.

Today the Cabell County Library occupies a building built in 1980 directly across the street from the old Carnegie building. Along with its downtown home, the library has a network of seven busy branches around the county. At the same time, Cabell County has a splendid park system that's the envy of many other West Virginia communities. But our libraries and parks face risky futures if the school board's outrageous slashing of library and park funding is allowed to stand. Library and park officials recognized that threat and went to court to challenge it. To his considerable credit, Judge Howard has endorsed that challenge. It's to be hoped the state Supreme Court will do the same.
